## Adjutant's Blog—February 2023 Kevin Chaplin



We have some fantastic news for members that have been wanting to renew online. This feature has been recently turned on and any member can renew online using the following link. <https://mylegion.org/PersonifyEbusiness/Membership/SAL-Renew> For any online membership renewals, the member will be charged \$5 for the National portion of the dues, \$10 for the Detachment portion of the dues and the balance will be what your Squadron charges. National will send the Detachment amount and the Squadron amount to Department Headquarters. They will then submit the Squadron portion to the Post

or Squadron. If your Squadron has not submitted the new Squadron Data Report or SDR, please do so as soon as possible. This form documents your Squadron's dues structure and if your Squadron has not submitted their form, members who renew online may be charged the incorrect dues amount. The form can be found on the SAL website. [www.vasons.org](http://www.vasons.org)

Soon it will be time to report your Squadrons' activities, donations, and involvement in the Legion Programs on the Consolidated Squadron Report or CSR. This report contains very important and valuable information. The Legion uses this data when they report to Congress and it shows the true value the Legion provides to our communities, state and the Nation. Last year the Detachment of Virginia donated over \$346,000 and volunteered 57,587 hours which has a value of \$1,643,533. We did this with only 46% of the Squadrons reporting. Consolidated Squadron Reports need to be completed and submitting by May 19th, 2023. We will have the form available on the website and we will email it to all Adjutants, Commanders, and Point of Contacts for each Squadron. We are shooting for 100% turn in rate this year. The Legion achieved this last year with their Consolidated Post Report (CPR) and with your help, we can do this too.

Have you logged into MyLegion.org yet? MyLegion.org is great resource for every member, not just the Squadron Commander or Adjutant. Once you log into MyLegion.org, you can subscribe to any of the newsletters the Sons and the Legion produce. These are electronic newsletters that are produced and emailed out on a regular basis. You will not get any of these unless you opt in or check the box. Some of the newsletters available are The Legion Commander's Message, Flag Alerts, The SAL Commander's Message, Legion Riders and Training in the American Legion. Getting access is easy and your Squadron Adjutant can help you if you do not have an email address associated with your account.

year, SAL members can pay their dues online. In the first month, 66,000 SAL members across the country renewed their membership. Please have your membership create an account. Once that is done, they can scroll to the bottom of the website, click on "Renew Membership" and enter their information. It's that easy!

As of today, we have 74 Likes and 80 Followers. We would like each member in our Detachment to like our page and share its content. It's the easiest way to share information on what is going on in the Detachment of Virginia. You can also share what is going on with your squadron to this page as a way to promote your events.

The Detachment's website, [www.vasons.org](http://www.vasons.org), is going to be overhauled over the next few months. We hope to have it ready by the Spring Conference but like all good things, time and patience are needed for quality. With this new site, it should be easy for you to get information needed for supporting your squadron and for awards.

# Remembering Four Chaplains Month

## After the sinking of the SS Dorchester

On February 3<sup>rd</sup>, 1943, the Four Chaplains were posthumously awarded the **Distinguished Service Cross** and **Purple Heart** on December 19, 1944. They were given to the next of kin by Lt. Gen. Brehon B. Somervell, Commanding General of the Army Service Forces, in a ceremony at the post chapel at Fort Myer, VA.

Congress wanted to award the **Medal of Honor** to the Chaplains, but due to the strict regulations for the heroism to be displayed under fire, they could not.

A one-time only posthumous **Special Medal for Heroism** was authorized by Congress and awarded by the President Eisenhower on January 18, 1961. *The special medal was intended to have the same weight and importance as the Medal of Honor.*

The time is now to begin submitting success stories for the Detachment of Virginia Americanism Awards. What is Americanism? According to the 2019 Squadron Handbook:

“Americanism: One of the four pillars of The American Legion The SAL plays a vital role in The American Legion to promote an understanding and appreciation of American government; the rights and responsibilities of American citizenship; and activity in the American way of life through youth activities, community service, education and educational facilities, and proper U S flag etiquette as well as the protection of the U S flag from physical desecration The SAL participates both as counselors and participants in Americanism programs such as Boys Nation, Boys State, Oratorical Contest, Scouting, and Junior Shooting sports in addition to providing scholarship money to various programs.”

I daresay that Americanism also includes participation in Color Guards, Funeral Honor Guards, Memorial Day and other patriotic occasions and service events where we promote the rights and responsibilities of citizenship and service.

The Detachment wants to tell your stories, but we can not if you do not tell us about them! Please, SEND ME A MESSAGE AND TELL ME ABOUT YOUR EFFORTS! The Americanism Committee wants to have candidates for Detachment Americanism Awards for large, medium, and small Squadrons. What you do for your communities and Posts is important.

The bottom line is that your Squadron is an asset to your sponsoring Post! Sons can augment Post programs (in addition to their own). The SAL Squadron is a Force Multiplier!

# Communication - Lifeline Of Our Organization

We always say that Membership is the Backbone of our organization. Communication is the Lifeline of our organization. The worst thing we can do is not to communicate with our members.

The Detachment of Virginia can pride itself on many things. One thing is that with our size, we are well represented at the National Level. We have people serving as Chairman, Public Media and Communications Commission, member of the Veterans Employment and Education Commission, member of the Membership Committee, member of the Internal Affairs Commission, and Assistant National Adjutant. The people serving in these capacities are serving because of their ideas, experience, and knowledge of the programs of the Sons of The American Legion.

Our National Officers, Commissions, and Committees work hard throughout the year—not just at the Fall and Spring NEC Meetings—but all year to work the programs, promote the programs, and come up with new ideas to support these programs.

This information is not meant to stay at the National Level. It is meant to be sent down to the Detachments and from the Detachments to the Squadrons and from the Squadrons to the 'Blue Cap' Members.

Yes, we said it—the information is meant to come down to our individual members. The intent is to inform but also share ideas within our Detachments and Squadrons. But even more importantly to make our 'Blue Cap' members feel as though they are a member of something larger.

There could be ideas for membership drives that are successful in Washington DC and could work in Virginia. There are fundraising ideas that are successful in Colorado that could be successful in Virginia. The exchange of ideas through communication can help our organization grow and become a stronger organization.

When this information is shared with our 'Blue Cap' members, some may be interested and want to work one of these projects for your Squadron. This is where we need to keep the information moving to ALL of our members—whether they serve as an officer or not.

One could argue the same thing for our Detachment. We have two conferences—Fall and Spring and a State Convention each year. We also have a SAL Legion Leadership College in August each year. We share a lot of information on these programs at these meetings. We also share a lot of information on what our Detachment is doing throughout the year.

As we move forward in time, technology improves our communication. The internet and social media are the top two forms of communication. We cannot let technology prevent us from making the personal phone calls, offering a hand shake, or saying hello to a member you have not seen. Regardless of how we do it, we must always be in communication with all of our members whether it is through the Internet, social media, or a phone call.

Over the past several years, it has become cost prohibitive to mail information out to our various Squadrons. Postage costs have increased and will continue to increase for the foreseeable future. This has forced us to change the way we communicate with our Squadrons. We have to communicate through our website, Facebook Page, or via email.

For the Detachment to communicate with our 'Blue Cap' members, we need the Squadrons to provide Contact information for each of the Squadrons. To date, our Adjutant has less than 50 percent of the Squadrons Contact information. This is less than 30 Squadrons of our 60 plus that appear on the Membership Report each week. We are making an urgent request from our Squadrons to send their Officer Lists into our Detachment Adjutant ([kchaplin@lexacom.net](mailto:kchaplin@lexacom.net)), as soon as possible.

The Detachment of Virginia does a majority of its communication through e-mail, our Detachment Website ([www.vasons.org](http://www.vasons.org)), or our Detachment Facebook Page - Sons Of The American Legion, Detachment of Virginia (New Facebook page set up July 2022).

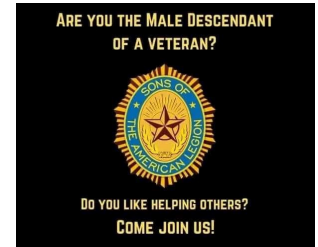
