Sons Donate \$450K to Child Welfare Foundation

The Sons Of the Ameri-Legion raised \$453,599.07 for American Legion Child Welfare Foundation this year. The Detachments of Ohio, Pennsylvania, Arizona, Illinois, Florida, Colorado, California, Indiana, New York, Virginia, Michigan, and New Jersey all contributed \$10,000 or more for the 2012-13 year. Ohio had the top honor for donating \$51,738.17. Through our efforts., we will again provide grants from the Child Welfare Foundation in October 2013.

So how does this grant process work and how are the recipients chosen? First, organizations who are dedicated to providing for the welfare of all children can apply for a grant or grants through the American Legion Child Welfare Foundation. The Grant applications are available on the Child Welfare Foundation website at www.cwf-inc.org. Once all of the applications are received, the Board narrows the number of applications to around 50 or so of those who fit well with the mission of the organization. Those 50 Grants are sent to various groups -The American Legion, American Legion Auxiliary, Sons Of The American Legion and others to request their recommendations. Those select their finalists and those are turned in to the Board for the American Legion Child Welfare Foundation to select the recipients for the given year.

The recipients are announced after the Fall NEC in October of each



year.

This year, over \$734,000 in grants were awarded. The American Academy of Pediatrics was awarded a grant of \$12,180, Childhood Leukemia Foundation was awarded a grant of \$60,000, Children's Organ Transplant Association was awarded grant of\$43,050, CureSearch For Children's Cancer was awarded a grant of \$25,500, Darkness to Light was
